The hostel is owned and managed by the Daughters of Mary (DM) Sisters, belonging to the Province of Mary Matha, Bathery. It was founded with the noble mission of supporting and empowering girl students of Fathima College by providing them with a safe, nurturing, and spiritually enriched environment conducive to their academic and personal growth.

Through this initiative, the DM Sisters continue their commitment to education, service, and the holistic development of young women, guided by the values of compassion, discipline, and faith.

Rules And Regulations For Inmates

The hostel is an integral part of campus life, offering students a safe, supportive, and disciplined environment that complements their academic journey. To ensure the well-being, comfort, and security of all residents, the college has established a set of rules and regulations that every inmate is expected to follow.

All students residing in the hostel are required to strictly adhere to these rules, which are designed to maintain order, protect individual rights, and uphold the values of the institution. By observing these regulations, inmates contribute to a positive and productive residential experience for themselves and their peers. These guidelines promote mutual respect, personal responsibility, and harmonious living atmosphere within the hostel community.

1. Students must maintain discipline, decency, and decorum within the hostel premises.
2. Any form of ragging, harassment, or discrimination is strictly prohibited and will lead to severe disciplinary action.
3. Respect for hostel staff, fellow residents, and college authorities is mandatory.
4. Students must stay in the rooms allotted to them and are not permitted to change rooms without prior approval.
5. Use of mobile phones is permitted only during designated hours.
6. Students are allowed to use mobile phones only between 6:00 AM and 9:40 PM. Mobile phones may be charged only during the designated time from 4:30 PM to 6:00 PM.
7. If students need to go outside the hostel for an overnight stay, they must submit a permission letter from their parents. Only then will the hostel warden grant them permission to leave.
8. Overnight stay outside the hostel requires prior written permission from the warden/authority.
9. All students must sign the attendance register daily as per hostel timings.
10. Entry and exit timings must be strictly adhered to. Late entries will be recorded and may result in disciplinary action.
11. Visitors are allowed only during visiting hours and must be registered at the hostel office.
12. Students are responsible for keeping their rooms and common areas clean and tidy.

13. .Use of personal electrical appliances (heaters, kettles, etc.) is not allowed without permission.
14. .Meals will be served only in the designated dining area during fixed hours.
15. Wastage of food is discouraged. Students are expected to follow proper dining etiquette.
16. Smoking, alcohol, drugs, and possession of any illegal substances are strictly banned.
17. Playing loud music, shouting, or creating disturbance is not permitted at any time.
18. Students must report any unusual or suspicious activity to the warden immediately.
19. Hostel gates will be locked at specified hours for safety purposes.
20. Any damage to hostel property will be charged to the student(s) responsible.
21. Intentional damage may lead to suspension or expulsion from the hostel.

Violation of any rule will invite disciplinary action, which may include warning, fine, suspension, or expulsion depending on the severity of the offense.
